

Early Years Pupil Premium

The Early Years Pupil Premium provides an extra 60 pence per hour for three and four-year-old children whose parents are in receipt of certain benefits or who were formerly in local authority care but who left care because they were adopted or were subject to a special guardianship or child arrangements order. This means an extra £342 a year for each child taking up the full 570 hours funded entitlement to early education. This additional money makes a significant difference to us. We can use the extra funding in any way we choose to improve the quality of the early years education that we provide for your child.
