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### Barriers to Attainment:

- Children enter with very limited communication and language skills.
- Children enter with very limited personal, social and emotional development.
- Children come from vulnerable families affecting their well-being.

<b>Item / Intervention</b>	<b>Cost</b>	<b>Outcome / Impact</b>
Specifically selected food for snack e.g. eggs, naan bread, baked beans.	£150	Children learn about healthy eating and are provided with a nutritious snack. Supporting the curriculum – learning about and eating food from different cultures. Recognition and celebration of food from own culture. Children develop skills such as using a knife and fork.
Purchase of reflective stickers during Road Safety week.	£15	Children learn about road safety and reinforced with parents – safety advice given regarding ‘transporting’ children, appropriate car seats, holding hands to cross roads, being seen and safe at night.
Entertainer for the Christmas party.	£50	Promotion of social skills – playing together, eating together, interacting and having fun together.

		Promotion of high well-being – children involved with entertainer and high levels of laughter.
Ensure Quality First Teaching at all times with experienced members of staff.	£381.78	Members of staff used to keep as high, quality ratios as possible at all times. Staff trained in communication and language skills – consistent use of modelling, commenting, extending vocabulary etc. Staff cover to enable 'EPIC' programme to take place to support communication and language skills. Both children in receipt of Pupil Premium attend EPIC.
